



Incident disrupts Parkway traffic

Traffic on the Nanaimo Parkway was stopped for a short time at East Wellington Road Wednesday night when a distraught youth threatened to jump from the overpass.

Const. Jack Eubank was unable to provide and exact age of the youth, or say what precipitated the incident.

Police were assisted by a passerby Eubank said may have been a psychiatric nurse. The unidentified woman talked to the youth, who agreed to move off the bridge less than an hour after the incident began. He was unharmed.

Police took the boy to the Nanaimo Regional General Hospital to be assessed by a psychiatrist. No charges are expected.






Métis-informed Perspective Two Eyed Seeing (Marshall, 2017)






Canada's War on Drugs




















Research Considerations

- Flexible research timelines and deliverables to adapt to community needs
- Honoring engagement protocols of local community
- Ensure your budget reflects community engagement
- Consider institutional barriers (timelines, expectations) that dont reflect community needs and protocols
- Research products should also be for communities affected by the research
- Oral consent may be preferable to written consent
- Individual consent may be challenging in light of collective knowledge and ownership
